Recipe for Retreat Honey Garlic Meatballs

- 1 28 oz bag of cooked/frozen beef meatballs
- Sauce: 3 cloves Garlic
- 1/3 cup Honey
- 1/2 cup Ketchup
- 2 Tbsp. Soy sauce
- 1/4 cup Brown Sugar

Throw all into a crock pot and cook on low for 6-8 hrs or high for 3-4 hrs.

TIP: Could add some crushed red pepper (1/4—1/2 tsp) VERY GOOD!
