August 28th Guild Program Cynthia Parry, *The Great Tohoku Triple Disaster*

This series is a direct result of my need to express the profound sympathy and compassion I felt for the people and the country of Japan as they struggled to recover from the horrific triple nightmare of March 11, 2011.



It was never intended as a series but rather as a single piece. Ideas flooded me and kept me up nights. I quickly realized it had to be more than one. It became what it needed to become: a series of fifteen. Members of my fiber art group, Fractured Fabrics, pointed out that there is a definite educational aspect to my series. Since education and continued learning is important to me, I am on a mission to educate the viewers of my pieces about Japan and the triple disaster that continues to effect life there.

- Dementia lap quilts were discussed as a potential sewing day. Jill Norenberg and Marilyn Bonow will lead the project and get a date set up.
- A list of door prize donors has been created. August donors have been notified via email.
- The list of greeters by month have been set up. Information will be in the yearbook.
- Hostesses have been set up for the year.
- The August meeting agenda will be the QOV presentation at 7:00pm and program at 7:30pm.
- There is a presentation at the IQM on Saturday, Aug. 12th. Tara Miller will be presenting on Mary Ghormley.
- Pam Schroeder reported that the guild has about 100 members.
