Motion to call meeting to order by Jill Norenberg, seconded by Danielle Smith

- Correction from last month's newsletter: Jill Norenberg was contacted by Covered Waters. Last month's donation will go to them as planned.

- All presenters for next year are confirmed. A picture and description will be needed for the yearbook.

- Everything for the yearbook will need to be sent to Chris Hoffman no later than June 30th for the yearbook.

- Marilyn Applebee will oversee door prizes for the upcoming year

- Motion made by Susan Williams, seconded by Tina Mommens to include Scott Flanagan as an honorary member.

- Postcards for the challenge will be displayed at the April meeting. There will be prizes for the 1st and 2nd place as voted on by meeting attendees. A reminder will be put in the newsletter.

- Monday, May 6th will be the turnover of the steering committee team.

- Discussion on the upcoming salad lunch at the April meeting. Recommendation that everyone bring a "normal" sized salad to avoid having too much food. Everyone should bring a serving spoon.

- Discussed ideas on how to decrease the length of the guild meetings and better organize when presenters have merchandise for sale. - Lutheran Family Services is requesting quilts for young adults that are aging out of the foster care system. These will go to a residence facility in Blair. ACME in Blair has a flyer with the information on the quilts needed.

- Tina Mommens will be monitoring the mailbox for 24/25.

- Pat Mommsen brought examples of flags for the quilt show. These will be put at the entrances on the day of the show. Committee agreed to order 2 of these signs and Pat will get them ordered. Committee also agreed not to use the small signs for the quilt show.

- The Fremont Chamber has a monthly newsletter. The guild could put something in there about the quilt show.

- Lisa Braasch will be the treasurer for the quilt show.

- For housekeeping for the quilt show we will need to request more trash cans with wheels from the church and inquire about using the refrigerator.

- For the garage sale, 6 long tables will be needed and will be set up in the back of the room. Try to price everything in multiples of \$.25.

- There are 30 raffle ticket packs that have not been picked up yet.

- Turnover meeting will be Monday, May 6th at 6:30 pm. Current committee members need to bring notebooks with updated information from past year.
