Quilts in the Garden

Bed Turning

Enjoy a summer evening in the gardens of the May Museum. Join your quilting friends for light refreshments, a walk in the garden guided by Linda Wagner and music. The program will begin at 7:00 pm and will feature beautiful quilts made by our guild members.

This is a modern take on an old fashion custom, Bed Turning. In the 1800's, to host a Bed Turning, a quilter would invite her friends to her home to see her work. She would stack her quilts on a bed and her friends would gather round to admire them; turning each quilt off the top of the bed to reveal another work of art

below. For our event, we will take the quilts off the bed and hold them up like we do for show & tell during guild. We will read a story about the quilt as it is shown.

The *Quilts in the Garden* event is open to Prairie Piecemakers members. **Tickets are \$5.00.** Proceeds go to the May Museum. After the first 60 tickets are sold, we will open the event to your friends and guests. We will only sell 100 tickets.

Members can show two full size quilt and one crib size quilt at the event. They can be previously shown at a quilt show or meeting or something new. Family heirloom keepsake quilts are welcome.



Forms will be available at the guild meeting and with the newsletter. You are asked to prepare a brief write-up about the quilt which will be read during the showing. Forms are due by the end of April. Each person showing a quilt will get a number or letter to place on their quilt(s). Quilts should arrive at the event by 6:00 pm with the number attached to the quilt(s). Members will take their quilts home after the program.
