Plus, don't forget all your SCRAPS.

WHAT AN AMAZING START TO OUR NEW YEAR!



Quilt of Valor Presentation

At our August meeting, we had the opportunity to be a part of a Quilts of Valor (Fremont) award presentation! Quilts of Valor's (QOV) mission is to cover service members and veterans touched by war with a comforting and healing quilt. The Fremont Group awarded two quilts to veterans honoring them for their service.

Donald Anderson served in the Navy during the Cold War from 1946 to 1948 as Seaman 1st class. Don served on the USS Los Angeles and the USS Duluth. He departed from San Diego and returned to Long Beach, working in the 1st Lieutenant's office. He remembers sailing to Australia, Guam, and Shanghai as part of the US Navy presence in the Pacific after World War II. Don lives in Fremont Nebraska.



1978 during the Cold War and the Vietnam War as Captain. Steve was stationed at the Ubon Royal Thai Air Base in 1971. Between 1973 and 1978, he was a Reconnaissance Pilot and flew 135 missions from bases including RAF Mildenhall England; Kadena AB Japan; Eilson AFB Alaska; and Hellenikon AB Greece. He was also delivery officer at Offutt AFB in NE. Steve was awarded the USAF Air Medal, 4 Oak Leaf Clusters. Steve is the son of Don Anderson and lives in Omaha.


Prairie Piecemakers Garage Sale
